Program Summary/Purpose

[34 CFR § 463.61](#) Up to 20 percent of the 82.5 percent of grant funds used for adult education and literacy activities can be used for corrections education programs under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title II Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA) and the Hawaii Unified State Plan.

The funds will provide adult education and literacy activities to criminal offenders in Hawaii correctional institutions and other institutionalized individuals. These programs will provide opportunities to promote successful adjustment to the community and prevent recidivism by enabling them to master the skills and strategies required for responsible citizenship, productive employment, college readiness, and family self-sufficiency.

Rationale for Allocation

\$216,772 in "T" funds will be allocated to CSA-Honolulu-Kauai-Maui-Moanalua, ORG ID 976000, to provide part-time teachers at correction facilities to deliver adult education and literacy activities, including Adult Basic Education and High School Equivalency classes, and pay for instructional

materials, and operational expenses.

Expenditures not included in the approved budget plan require approval from the AEFLA state director.

AEFLA funds cannot be used for high school equivalency test fees, such as the General Educational Development (GED) and High School Equivalency Test (HiSET). AEFLA funds can be

used to purchase GED and HiSET high school equivalency practice tests as instructional materials in a class.
