Program Summary/Purpose

Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Title II Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA) and the Hawaii Unified State Plan, the US Department of Education Grant Award Notification specifies the amount of funds that must be utilized to provide an Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education program at the Community Schools for Adults (CSAs) and their respective campuses.

[34 CFR § 463.73](#) What are the requirements for eligible providers that receive funding through the Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education program?

Eligible providers receiving funds through the Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education program must provide services that -

- a. Include instruction in literacy and English language acquisition and instruction on the rights and responsibilities of citizenship and civic participation; and
- b. Are designed to:
 - a. Prepare adults who are English language learners for, and place such adults in unsubsidized employment in in-demand industries and occupations that lead to economic self-sufficiency; and
 - b. Integrate with the local workforce development system and its functions to carry out the activities of the program.

Rationale for Allocation

\$208,242 in "T" funds will be allocated to CSA-Honolulu-Kauai-Maui-Moanalua, ORG ID 976000, and \$208,241 in "T" funds will be allocated to CSA-Hawaii-Leeward-Wahiawa- Windward, ORG ID 977000 to implement AEFLA Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education programs and provide the services described in the program summary/purpose.

This grant award is issued pursuant to the grantee's approved State Plan under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).

This award includes funds which may be used only for integrated English literacy and civics education services to immigrants and other limited English proficient populations, as defined in [Section 243 of AEFLA](#). The amount of these funds provided to your state is \$416,483.

2 CFR 200.307 applies to this award, which allows State grantees under the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA) to earn program income. 2 CFR 200.1 defines "program income" generally to mean "gross income earned by the non-Federal entity that is directly generated by a supported activity or earned as a result of the Federal award during the period of performance..." Ordinarily, program income is deducted from total allowable program costs, and all program income, except for tuition and fees charged to students and employers earned by a subgrantee under this award, must be so deducted. A local subgrantee charging reasonable and necessary tuition or fees to students and employers may use that income to provide additional adult education and literacy services that it would otherwise be unable to provide. Program income from tuition and fees must be (1) governed by the terms of the agreement between the State grantee and the local subgrantee to which the State provides federal funds, (2) accounted for in

program records, and (3) used only for costs allowable under AEFLA. Also applicable to this award is 34 CFR 76.534, which provides that States and subgrantees may not count tuition and fees collected from students toward meeting federal matching, cost-sharing, or maintenance of effort requirements related to this award. Moreover, States must ensure that fees charged to students participating in an adult education program that receives federal support are equitably administered and do not reach levels that have an adverse effect on the participation of economically disadvantaged students.

AEFLA funds are distributed to the community schools for adults to provide AEFLA services defined in 34 CFR Part 463 and shall be expended following the AEFLA state director-approved budget plans for this grant aligned to the Hawaii Unified State Plan. Expenditures not included in the approved budget plan require approval from the AEFLA state director.

AEFLA funds cannot be used for high school equivalency test fees, such as the General Educational Development (GED) and High School Equivalency Test (HiSET). AEFLA funds can be used to purchase GED and HiSET high school equivalency practice tests as instructional materials in a class.
