Expanded Eligibility Pilot Program (E2P2)

What is the E2P2 Program?

The Expanded Eligibility Pilot Program (E2P2) is an enrollment expansion authorized by the National Defense Authorization Act. Its purpose is to evaluate the feasibility and scalability of a permanent DVHS program after four years (starting SY 21-22) as well as assess the impact of the expanded enrollment on military and family readiness. The pilot is open to active-duty, military-connected, high school students in the U.S. and will supplement (not compete with) school districts and private programs. Students in this program may take up to two non-core credits per year.

Eligibility Requirements

- School-aged dependent of an active-duty member of the armed forces
- Sponsor stationed in the U.S.
- Must be in grades 9 through 12
- Ineligible to enroll in a DoDEA school (outside of the E2P2 program)
- Require supplementary courses to graduate in current state
OR
- Demonstrate a clear need to participate in the DVHS program

Application Process

- 1 Parents of students who meet the eligibility requirements of the E2P2 program must submit a completed application available on the [DVS E2P2 web page](#).
- 2 Application must include courses requested (up to 2 credits per year) and signatures of student, sponsor, and local school principal or designee (if not homeschooled).
- 3 Courses are offered on a semester basis, commencing each fall and spring.

Expanded Eligibility Pilot Program (E2P2) FAQs

What courses are offered?

- Non-core courses, including Career and Technical Education (CTE), Advanced Placement, and World Languages.

Are DVHS classes synchronous?

- The DVHS model is asynchronous content with synchronous support.

How often is attendance required for the courses and are the schedules flexible?

- Attendance is reflected by the student following the assignment schedule and submitting work in a timely manner. Teachers maintain flexible hours and adjust their schedules to provide synchronous support for the student during the work week.

How do I know if my request has been accepted?

- Once the submitted application has been approved, DVHS administration will notify the parents via email.

Can classes be taken over the summer or year-round?

- DVHS follows a traditional calendar of a Fall and Spring semester. Courses are not offered year-round.

Are DVHS courses self-paced? Will they have specific log in times for lessons/exams?

- Our courses are not self-paced. While there are no specific log in times, there is an assignment schedule that lists due dates and windows of opportunities to complete exams. Teachers maintain flexible hours and adjust their schedules to provide synchronous support for the student during the work week.

What is the course schedule?

- DVHS course schedules are aligned with the DoDEA school calendar dates each year. In general, Semester 1 begins the fourth week in August and ends the third week of January. Semester 2 begins the fourth week of January and ends the third week of June. Individual dates vary year-to-year. For more information, please see [school calendar on the DVHS website](#).
- Adjustments will be made for students who enter the course due to PCS after the third week of class.

Will DVHS courses meet graduation requirements in my state?

- Your local school must verify that courses taken with DVHS will meet their graduation requirements and is why we require the local school administration to sign the application.
- DoDEA Virtual High School is fully accredited with Cognia (formerly AdvancED). [Cognia accreditation](#) represents the unified policies and procedures for accreditation and certification from its three Accreditation Divisions. These comprise three of the six regionally recognized K-12 accrediting bodies and together have been accrediting institutions for 125 years.

The DoDEA Virtual High School (DVHS) is a fully accredited high school.

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What are the technical requirements for student participation?

- Students must have access to reliable Internet and a computer or Chromebook. (Some courses will not work on a Chromebook.) For more specific information, please view the [Technical Requirements page](#) of the DVHS website.
- The course software is web based and does not require installation. Computer Science courses do require the installation of a free programming application.

How do students get help if they are experiencing issues?

- The teacher of the course will be the student's first line of support. Teachers maintain flexible hours and adjust their schedules to provide synchronous support for the student during the work week. If the student has a technical issue and the teacher is not available, we have Educational Technologists (ET) on duty almost 24 hours a day/5 days a week. To access ET support, students should submit a [DVS Tech Help Desk ticket](#).

What coordination is needed with the stateside school district/accredited educational program?

- The sponsor should contact the school district/program to determine what local support may be provided to students enrolled in a DVHS course, such as scheduling the course during the school day, before or after school hours, course credit acceptance, test proctoring assistance, etc.

How are grades communicated?

- Official grade reports will be sent electronically to the student's and sponsor's email addresses on file. Parents also have the option of creating a GradeSpeed account to monitor student progress. E2P2 parents would submit a [DVS Technical Help Desk ticket](#) to request an account.

How will I receive a final transcript?

- Transcripts are provided to the local school at the end of each semester. Also, transcripts are provided upon appropriate written authorization and signatures of the student or parent/guardian (if the student is under 18). Please contact [DVHS Counseling Services](#) for more information.
