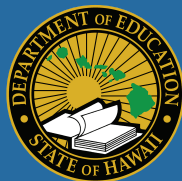


On average, each school year, the HAWAII DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION identifies

THE MCKINNEY VENTO ACT

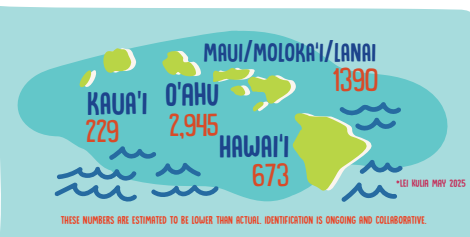
IS THE PRIMARY PIECE OF LEGISLATION THAT ENSURES EDUCATIONAL STABILITY FOR CHILDREN & YOUTH EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS.

EACH SCHOOL MOVE IS ASSOCIATED WITH UP TO 6 MONTHS OF LEARNING LOSS.

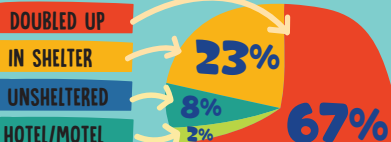


THE EDUCATION FOR HOMELESS CHILDREN & YOUTH TEAM (EHCY)

PRIMARY NIGHTTIME RESIDENCE

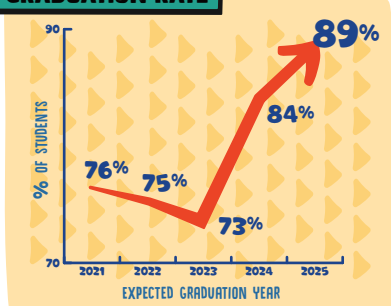

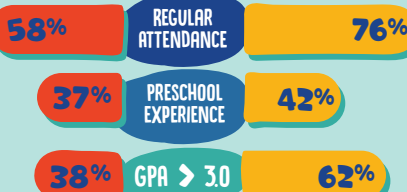
