Executive Summary

The annual Hawai'i State Department of Education (HIDOE) Employment Report is a summary of workforce data and employment figures, and characteristics of newly-hired teachers and Classified/Support Services Personnel (CSSP) for the school year (SY) 2023-24 as well as data from prior years.



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Workforce Data

The HIDOE employs about 13,000 teachers, librarians, counselors, and an additional 12,000 educational officers, civil service, and support services personnel to ensure all students have equal opportunity for a high-quality education.
