

Safety and Wellness Survey (SAWS)

Data Report for School Year 2024-2025

The Safety and Wellness Survey (SAWS) measures school level implementation of the Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) Wellness Guidelines across the state. Survey results from the School Year 2024-25 (SY24/25) are provided in this report, in accordance with the USDA's final rule for Local School Wellness Policy Implementation under the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010, as well as the Hawaii Board of Education policy 103-1.

The SAWS is an online survey administered annually to principals at public (non-charter) schools and uses the following scoring criteria: one (1) point for a guideline that is fully met and zero (0) for a guideline not met. In SY 24/25, 253 of 258 eligible schools completed the survey. Overall, 81% of the Wellness Guidelines were met. School scores ranged from 38% to 100% implementation of the Wellness Guidelines. The Hawaii Department of Health is awarding banners for "Excellence in Wellness", recognizing 74 schools that met 90% or more of the guidelines.

Compliance with individual guidelines varied, with some guidelines being achieved by 100% of schools and others being achieved by only a minority of schools. In SY 24/25, there were 34 points possible for schools. The overall score is calculated by dividing the number of points achieved by the total points possible. Please see the paragraphs below for summaries of SAWS results by Wellness Guidelines domain.

Wellness Committee

One hundred sixty-seven schools (66%) indicated that they had a designated Wellness Coordinator (WC1), and 179 schools (71%) indicated that they had a Wellness Committee (WC2). WC6, which relates to the school community being notified about the wellness policy and being provided the wellness coordinator contact information, was met by 108 schools (43%).

Nutrition Guidelines

The guidelines that relate to the school meals program (NG1 and NG5) are the responsibility of the HIDOE School Food Services Branch and were fully implemented by 100% of schools. Guidelines NG2 and NG3, which relate to the nutritional quality of foods and beverages sold or provided to students outside of the meals program (e.g., school parties, student stores, vending machines, and fundraisers) have consistently been the most difficult for schools to fulfill. This year, 97 schools (38%) met this guideline for foods (NG2), and 134 schools (53%) met this guideline for beverages (NG3).

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Health Education and Nutrition Promotion

HE1, which advises that Health Education instructional content align with HIDOE Health Education Standards and include a focus on knowledge and skills to support healthy eating, was met by 224 schools (89%). One hundred ninety-nine schools (79%) report that students received the recommended instructional minutes of Health Education per week (HE2). Schools also reported including farm visits, food preparation, and school garden activities as part of their nutrition education activities (HE3).

Physical Education

PE2, which advises that students receive the recommended instructional minutes for Physical Education per week, was met by 228 schools (90%). Two hundred and six schools (82%) report that Physical Education was taught by a state certified teacher (PE4). Almost all schools (249) reported student/teacher ratios similar to other classes (PE5).

Physical Activity

PA1, which inquires if all students receive at least 20 minutes per day of recess that includes opportunities to engage in moderate to vigorous physical activity, was met by 239 schools (95%). Two hundred twenty-four schools (89%) reported physical activity breaks at least every 60 minutes (PA2).

Professional Development

PD1, which inquires if school staff receive professional development on the HIDOE Wellness Guidelines, was met by 166 schools (66%). Two hundred thirty-nine schools (95%) report staff modeling wellness for students, with the top modes being modeling eating healthy foods, drinking healthy beverages like water, and demonstrating stress management techniques (PD2).

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Data Release Notes:

- Kulanihakai High School was a new school with only grades 9, 10, and 11 in SY 24/25. To provide a fair evaluation given that the school is new and has not yet had sufficient time to fully implement the program, it was excluded from the overall State-level score, the Baldwin-Kekaulike-Kulanihakai-Maui Complex Area score, and the Kulanihakai Complex score.
- While 253 out of 258 schools completed the survey, the overall State-level score is calculated from 252 schools. Please see note above regarding Kulanihakai High School.
- HIDOE revised its wellness policy in March 2017. As of June 30, 2017, schools should be fully implementing the updated Wellness Guidelines.

Summary of Wellness Guidelines Scores for School Year 2024-25

WC1	66%	The school has a designated wellness coordinator.
WC2	71%	The school has a wellness committee that includes members of the school community and/or members of the general public (e.g., representatives of community organizations, public agencies, or locally elected officials)
WC3	60%	The school wellness committee meets at least three times per school year.
WC4	65%	The wellness committee uses the School Health Index or other data sources (e.g., Youth Risk Behavior Survey data) to identify priority areas and to monitor improvements in those areas annually.
